



On-Point Setting Triangles

When an on-point quilt is made, the edges do not square off as a regular quilt does. There are two types of triangles that help fill in the gaps of an on-point quilt.

- 1. Side triangles fill in the gaps along all 4 edges of the quilt*
- 2. Corner triangles fill in the gaps on all 4 corners of the quilt*

The cut sizes below already include seam allowance — the rounding is done for you.

Cut-square sizes by block

- Side triangles:** cut a square this size, then cut it in an X (both diagonals) → 4 triangles, straight grain on the outside edge.*
- Corner triangles:** cut a square this size, then cut once corner-to-corner → 2 triangles. (Four corners = two corner squares.)*
